
# Getting Closely Connected & Making an Impact

Here is a list of much needed wraparound services. We've added a statement regarding a suggested donation to support them. Please consider helping us help Our Neighbors.

- The Market at Crossroads supplies groceries— Your \$1.00 donation gives us \$4.80 worth of purchasing power with the Food Bank for Larimer County, and select vendors.
- Rental & Mortgage assistance—\$1,000 saves an eviction
- Utilities assistance—\$200 keeps the lights on
- Case management with wraparound services
- ♥ Helping Hub—transportation and errands— \$100 provides 5 rides to essential services
- Non-medical care and support for cancer patients
- Life Coaching—job placement, budgeting, general assistance
- ◆Estes Pak—food bags for students on the weekends
   —\$400 provides one student a food bag for every weekend throughout the school year
- Meals on Wheels delivery program—\$140 provides a Senior with hot meals for one month (\$1,680 for one year)
